CIADA Running Bill to Help Owners of 8 to 11 Year Old Vehicles

The purpose of this legislation is very simple—that the denial of an Emission Test cannot be based solely on the fact that a "check-engine" light is illuminated on the vehicle's dashboard.

Currently, owners of 8 to 11 year old vehicles are forced to perform "maintenance" on their vehicles because they will not be emission tested if the check engine light is on. There are many reasons why a check engine light turns on that is not related to emission equipment failures.

- This bill will allow 8 to 11 year old vehicles to be tested even if the check engine light is on.
- This bill will reduce the number of times a vehicle is unable to be tested because a monitor is not ready.
- This bill will put the 8 to 11 year old vehicles in the same class as 12 year old and older vehicles—the opportunity to pass the emission test even though the "check-engine" light might be on.
- Owners of 8 to 11 year old vehicles can pass the "Rapid Screen" mobile test stations with the "check-engine" light on while vehicles that go to the Air Care Colorado testing stations are not allowed to test even if clean burning.
